Gospel Meditation

The Conversion of Saul (Paul) Acts 9:1–31

- 1. Saul was on his way to Damascus, a 5-day trip 135 miles north of Jerusalem, with the intent of and approval from the Jewish religious leaders to harass and even do away with Jews who had turned to Jesus as Savior and Lord.
- 2. Along the way, a huge light from heaven knocked Saul on the ground, and he heard a voice calling to him. It was Jesus Himself, asking Saul why he was persecuting Him.
- 3. Everyone around him was stunned by great light and thunder-like noise, and Saul was left speechless as Jesus instructed him to enter the city of Damascus. For three days he could not see and ate and drank nothing.
- 4. A disciple of Jesus named Ananias was sent by God to where Paul was on a street called Straight (it is still to be seen in Damascus). Though Ananias had heard of Saul and that he harassed the saints in Jerusalem, still he went to be with Saul, as Saul was a "chosen instrument" of God's.
- 5. Ananias then laid hands on Saul who then could see again. Ananias told Saul that Jesus has sent him so that he could see again but also be filled with the Holy Spirit.
- 6. Saul was then baptized or dunked in water. For days he was with the believers in Damascus and soon after began proclaiming Jesus in the local synagogues, which became his normal means of evangelism.
- 7. After some time, the religious Jews plotted to kill him, but Saul was able to escape with help from other disciples. He then returned to Jerusalem.
- 8. The believers there were initially fearful of Saul, as they could not accept right away that he was now a believer. But Barnabas defended Saul, who was then accepted as a genuine Christian brother.
- 9. Saul began witnessing to Jews in Jerusalem, including Greek-speaking Jews, known as Hellenists, who turned against him, even seeking to kill him.
- 10. However, while this attempt was ongoing, the believers sent Saul off to Tarsus, up in modern-day Syria. Acts concludes this event with the fact that in Judea, Galilee, and Samaria, many came to faith.

Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again

to judge the living and the dead.
